In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בְּרָא אֱלֹהִים (הִנֵּיתוּ עַל שְׁלֹשׁ מֵאוֹת הֶלֶל בַּפֶּעַם אֶחָת
ESV	This is an account of David's mighty men: Jashobeam, a Hachmonite, was chief of the three. He wielded his spear against 300 whom he killed at one time.
NIV	this is the list of David's mighty men: Jashobeam, a Hacmonite, was chief of the officers; he raised his spear against three hundred men, whom he killed in one encounter.
NLT	Here is the record of David's mightiest warriors: The first was Jashobeam the Hacmonite, who was leader of the Three- the mightiest warriors among David's men. He once used his spear to kill 300 enemy warriors in a single battle.
