The Hebrew את word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article תַּ-Genesis 1:1 דְּנִיק דֹּ

- ESV Of Issachar, men who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do, 200 chiefs, and all their kinsmen under their command.
- NIV men of Issachar, who understood the times and knew what Israel should do-200 chiefs, with all their relatives under their command;
