The Hebrew **אתָּ** word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article **הַ**. Genesis 1:1 **הַדּוֹרָם בָּנוּ אֶל הַמֶּלֶךְ דָּוִד לְשֹׂאֵל לוֹ**

בְּרָךְ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

Meaning

* To kneel * To bless God as an act of adoration * To bless man as a benefit * Sometimes, to curse

Verb, appearing approximately 330 times in the Old Testament.

The word **בְּרָךְ** marks important moments of covenant, worship, inheritance and hope. Genesis 1:28 Psalm 103:1 Numbers 6:24 **הִיא** plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

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The word **הִיא** means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.

This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.

* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3 Exodus 3:12 Ruth 1:1 Isaiah 2:2 **הַדְּעֹז וְכָל כְּלִי זָהָב וְכֶסֶף וְנְחָשֶׁת**

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
