Hebrew	יהוה יהוה hebrew Meaning * Yahweh - God's personal name It is not a generic term for “god”, but rather the word יהוה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament. ESV	Be careful now, for the LORD has chosen you to build a house for the sanctuary; be strong and do it.”

NLT	So take this seriously. The LORD has chosen you to build a Temple as his sanctuary. Be strong, and do the work.”
