Hebrew	<p>הִיָּה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big</p> <p>hebrew</p> <p>The word הִיָּה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.</p> <p>This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.</p> <p>* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 בְּיַד אֱשֶׁר נִוְלַד לוֹ בְּחֶבְרוֹן הַבְּכוֹר אֲמֹנֹן לְאֶחָיו אֵלִיעֶזֶר הַיְזְרְעֵאלִית שְׁנֵי דָנִיֵּאל לְאִבְיָגַיִל הַכַּרְמֶלִית</p>
ESV	<p>These are the sons of David who were born to him in Hebron: the firstborn, Amnon, by Ahinoam the Jezreelite; the second, Daniel, by Abigail the Carmelite,</p>
NIV	<p>These were the sons of David born to him in Hebron: The firstborn was Amnon the son of Ahinoam of Jezreel; the second, Daniel the son of Abigail of Carmel;</p>
NLT	<p>These are the sons of David who were born in Hebron: The oldest was Amnon, whose mother was Ahinoam from Jezreel. The second was Daniel, whose mother was Abigail from Carmel.</p>

Meaning

* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” οὗτοιplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὗτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο

greek

Meaning:

* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 ἦσανplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί

greek

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. οὐκ Δαυιδ οἱplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

The definite article τεχθέντες αὐτῶplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός

greek

Meaning

* He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

Preposition meaning “in”. Χεβρων ὁplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

The definite article Αχινααμ τῆplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

greek

The definite article Ιεζραηλίδι ὁplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

The definite article δεύτερος Δανηλ τῆplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

greek
