	הָיָה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigהָיָה hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 שָׁתִי נָשִׁים חֲלָאָה וְנִעְרָה
ESV	Ashhur, the father of Tekoa, had two wives, Helah and Naarah;
NIV	Ashhur the father of Tekoa had two wives, Helah and Naarah.
NLT	Ashhur (the father of Tekoa) had two wives, named Helah and Naarah.
LXX	καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” τῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article Σαουρ πατρὶ Θεκωε ἦσαν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. δύο γυναῖκες Ἀωδα καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” Θεαδα
