Hebrew	<p>הָיָה לְהֵם לְכֵּן לְמִשְׁפַּחַת הַקְּהֹתִי כִּי לְהֵם הָיָה          plugin-autotooltip__default          plugin-autotooltip_big הָיָה</p> <p>hebrew</p> <p>The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.</p> <p>This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.</p> <p>* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 הַיּוֹרֵד</p>
ESV	and his brother Asaph, who stood on his right hand, namely, Asaph the son of Berechiah, son of Shimea,
NIV	and Heman's associate Asaph, who served at his right hand: Asaph son of Berekiah, the son of Shimea,
NLT	Heman's first assistant was Asaph from the clan of Gershon. Asaph's genealogy was traced back through Berekiah, Shimea,
