Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

δέ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big δέ

greek

δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English.

The definite article κλητοῖς, Ἰουδαίοις τε καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big καί

Meaning

* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” Ἑλλῆσιν, Χριστὸν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big Χριστός

Christ means “anointed one”

The equivalent Hebrew word is Messiah (מָשִׁיחַ)

Noun, masculine. θεοῦ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big θεὸς
