	δεῖ γὰρ καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” αἰρέσεις ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. ὑμῖν εἶναι, greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἵνα οἱ Greek autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article δόκιμοι φανεροὶ γίνωνται greek Meaning * To Become * To Come into being * Generate * To Happen * Brought to pass Verb. Different from εἰμί (which means “to be” - a state of existence); γίνομαι, instead, emphasizes coming to be - a transition or event.John 1:14John 1:3Matthew 6:10 ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. ὑμῖν.
