	ὅτι greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ὅ greek The definite article θεός greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God ἔθετο τὰ greek Greek The definite article μέλη, ἐν ἑκάστων αὐτῶν, greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. τῷ greek The definite article σώματι καθὼς ἠθέλησεν.
ESV	But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose.
NIV	But in fact God has arranged the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be.
NLT	But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it.
KJV	But now hath God set the members every one of them in the body, as it hath pleased him.

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
