Usage in the New Testament

The sense of  $\pi\alpha$  depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns  $\rightarrow$  "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 λαλῶσιν γλώσσαις, εἰσέλθωσιν δὲplugin-autotooltip\_default plugin-autotooltip bigδέ

δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ἰδιῶται ἢ ἄπιστοι, οὐκ ἐροῦσιν ὅτι μαίνεσθε;
