| Greek | <p>* Who * Which * What</p> <p>The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).</p> <p>It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning γράφω ὑμῖν ὅτι κυρίου ἐστίν·</p> <p>greek</p> <p>εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).</p> <p>It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense.
