It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. θεὸς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigθεὸς greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God δίδωσιν αὐτῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός greek Greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) σῶμα καθὼς ἠθέλησεν, καὶ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigκαί greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐκάστῳ τῶν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ greek The definite article σπερμάτων ἴδιον σῶμα.
ESV	But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body.

NLT	Then God gives it the new body he wants it to have. A different plant grows from each kind of seed.
