Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "and" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. σὰρξ κτηνῶν, ἄλλη δὲ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big δέ
