	ὅτι ἡ greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Forms Singular Case Masculine Feminine Neuter Nominative ὁ ἡ τό Genitive τοῦ τῆς τοῦ Dative τῷ τῇ πίστις ὑμῶν μὴ ἡ greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. σοφία ἀνθρώπων ἀλλ’ ἐν greek Preposition meaning “in”. δυνάμει θεοῦ. greek Masculine noun meaning: * A god or goddess * God
ESV	that your faith might not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of God.
NIV	so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power.
NLT	I did this so you would trust not in human wisdom but in the power of God.
KJV	That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God.

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
