	The definite article ἀλήθεια οὐκ ἔστιν

	greek
	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).
	It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐν

	Preposition meaning “in”. ἡμῖν.
	ESV
	If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
	NIV
	If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.
	NLT
	If we claim we have no sin, we are only fooling ourselves and not living in the truth.
KJV	If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
