Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9 John 3:16 Romans 5:12 Matthew 28:19 Colossians 1:16 Romans 3:23 John 3:16 Colossians 1:17 πνεύματι πιστεύετε, ἀλλὰ δοκιμάζετε τὰplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

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The definite article πνεύματα εἰ ἐκ τοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

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The definite article θεοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigθεὸς

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Masculine noun meaning:

* A god or goddess * God ἐστιν,plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί

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εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ὅτι πολλοὶ ψευδοπροφῆται ἐξεληλύθασιν εἰς τὸνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ

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The definite article κόσμον.
