	The Hebrew אֶת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.
	For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by וַיְהִי בַּיּוֹם הַרְּאִשֹּׁן וַיִּבְרָא אֱלֹהִים (וַיִּבְרָא בְּנוֹ וַתִּגְמַלְהוּ תַּחְפֹּזִים בְּתוֹךְ בֵּית פְּרַעֲה וַיְהִי הָיָה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

ESV	The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
	This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.
	* It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 וַיִּבְרָא בְּנוֹ וַתִּגְמַלְהוּ תַּחְפֹּזִים בְּתוֹךְ בֵּית פְּרַעֲה וַיְהִי פְּרַעֲה
NIV	And the sister of Tahpenes bore him Genubath his son, whom Tahpenes weaned in Pharaoh's house. And Genubath was in Pharaoh's house among the sons of Pharaoh.
NLT	The sister of Tahpenes bore him a son named Genubath, whom Tahpenes brought up in the royal palace. There Genubath lived with Pharaoh's own children.
