Meaning

\* Yahweh - God's personal name

Hebrew ti is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word אוף (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

The Hebrew א word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ.Genesis 1:1 רָאֵל

He did what was evil in the sight of the LORD and walked in the way of his father, and in his sin which he made Israel to sin.

He did evil in the eyes of the LORD, walking in the ways of his father and in his sin, which he had caused Israel to commit.

But he did what was evil in the LORD's sight and followed the example of his father, continuing the sins that Jeroboam had led Israel to commit.
