	<p>hebrew</p> <p>The Hebrew אֵת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.</p> <p>For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by לְבָבָם (לְבָבָם) אֵלֹהִים אֵלֹהִים plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big יהוה;</p> <p>hebrew</p> <p>Meaning:</p> <p>* The heart * Used figuratively for the feelings, the will and even the intellect * The centre of anything</p> <p>Noun, masculine (although conceptually neutral, being used for both men and women). εἶμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. [κύριος ὁ](#)
