	הָיָהבֶן אֲבִינָדָב כָּל נֶפֶת דָּאֵר טַפַּת בֵּת שְׁלֹמֹה הָיָה hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 לֹא אִשָּׁה לוֹ
ESV	Ben-abinadab, in all Naphath-dor (he had Taphath the daughter of Solomon as his wife);
NIV	Ben-Abinadab-in Naphoth Dor (he was married to Taphath daughter of Solomon);
NLT	Ben-abinadab, in all of Naphoth-dor. (He was married to Taphath, one of Solomon's daughters.)

IT is most frequently translated as “and” Αναφαθι ἀνὴρ Ταβληθ θυγάτηρ Σαλωμων ἦν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. αὐτῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigαὐτός LXX greek Meaning * He, she, it * Himself, herself, itself * Same Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) εἷς γυναῖκα εἷς plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἷς gree Meaning: * One * First * One thing * Alone * Individual * One ma * Someone εἷς is the cardinal number (“one”). Sometimes it functions as a indefinitely pronoun (“someone” or “a certain one”). It agrees in gender, number and case with the noun it modifies. Occurs a little under 350 times in the New Testament.
