Usage in the New Testament

The sense of  $\pi \tilde{\alpha} \zeta$  depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 ὄσα ἐὰν εἴπῃς ὅτι σὺ οἶδας ὅτι οὐκ ἔστινplugin-autotooltip default plugin-autotooltip bigεἰμί

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").
