Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9 John 3:16 Romans 5:12 Matthew 28:19 Colossians 1:16 Romans 3:23 John 3:16 Colossians 1:17 [ὅσα ἐὰν](#) εἴπῃς [ὅτι σὺ οἶδας](#) [ὅτι οὐκ ἔστιν](#) plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. [ἡμῖν](#) εἰδὼς [ξύλα κόπτειν καθὼς οἶ](#) plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big ὁ
