Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" ἐπιμαρτυρῶν ταύτην plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὗτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο

Meaning:

* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — "this" as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:16)

εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἀληθῆ χάριν τοῦ
