[εἰμί](#) is the first person singular verb for “to be” ([εἶναι](#) [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example [εἰμί](#) is the word for am and [ἦν](#) is the word for was, e.g. [σοι ὅτι κλαίεις καὶ](#)[plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big](#)[καί](#)
