Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is

countable or uncountable.

Preposition meaning "in". **χειρὶ ἀγγέλων λέγων ὃς οὐκ ἔστιν** plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for "to be" (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = "to be").

It is an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. **ἐκπορευόμενος ὀπίσω Σαουλ καὶ** plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big καί
