NIV	For the sake of his great name the LORD will not reject his people, because the LORD was pleased to make you his own.
NLT	The LORD will not abandon his people, because that would dishonor his great name. For it has pleased the LORD to make you his very own people.

When used with the genitive case, διά emphasizes the means or channel by which something happens.
