In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by הָאָרֶץ בְּסֵבֶד וְהָיָה עֲבֹדָה וְהָיָה plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big הָיָה hebrew The word הָיָה means "to exist" or "to be" or "to become" or "to come into being" and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament.
