Hebrew	הָיָה יֵצֵא מִן־הַקֶּדְמוֹנִי מִרְשָׁעִים יֵצֵא רָשָׁע וְיָדִי לֹא תִהְיֶה hebrew The word הָיָה means “to exist” or “to be” or “to become” or “to come into being” and occurs 3561 times in the Old Testament. This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence. * It is used in the creation narrative of Genesis 1, represented by the English words Genesis 1:3Exodus 3:12Ruth 1:1Isaiah 2:2 בָּרָא
	ESV After whom has the king of Israel come out? After whom do you pursue? After a dead dog! After a flea!
	NIV “Against whom has the king of Israel come out? Whom are you pursuing? A dead dog? A flea?
	NLT Who is the king of Israel trying to catch anyway? Should he spend his time chasing one who is as worthless as a dead dog or a single flea?
LXX	καὶ greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences.
