The sense of $\pi\alpha\varsigma$ depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

λόγος in Greek Thought

Before the New Testament, $\lambda \acute{o}\gamma o \varsigma$ already had deep philosophical use. In Greek philosophy, $\lambda \acute{o}\gamma o \varsigma$ was the rational principle that ordered the universe, the divine reason that structured all things.
