The Hebrew **אתָּ** word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by **הָאֵלֹהִים (הַשּׁוֹק וְהַעֲלִיָּה וְיִשָּׁם לִפְנֵי שָׂאוֹל וַיֹּאמֶר הִנֵּה)** **אֶתְּ** plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big Examples
