	Περὶ δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean “but” or “and” or “also” or “moreover”. It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. τῆς greek Meaning: * The The definite article. Core uses Function English Equivalent Typical Translation Example (Greek) Example (English) γὰρ ὑμεῖς θεοδίδακτοί ἐστε greek εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. εἰς τὸ greek Meaning: * The The definite article.
