Greek	Adjective. Usage in the New Testament The sense of ἅς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable. With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 τὸ ἅς greek The definite article μαρτύριον καιροῖς ἰδίαις.
ESV	who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time.
NIV	who gave himself as a ransom for all men-the testimony given in its proper time.
NLT	He gave his life to purchase freedom for everyone. This is the message God gave to the world at just the right time.
KJV	Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time.

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
