Meaning:

* Who * Which * What

The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or
pronoun (called the antecedent).

It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older

Different from εἶμι (which means “to be” - a state of existence); γίνομαι, instead, emphasizes coming
