The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).

It is distinct from [ὅ](#)τι ("that," introducing indirect speech) and from [ὅ](#)ς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning [ἔ](#)δωκα [τῇ](#)plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigό, ή, τό

εἶμι is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἶμι is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. τῷ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ, ἡ, τό

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161
