The Hebrew אתָּ word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. It only ever occurs in conjunction with nouns associated with the definite article הַ. Genesis 1:1 אֱלֹהִים plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigאֶתְּ

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Meanings:

* God * god * goddess * divine ones * angels

Noun, masculine אֶתְּ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigאֶתְּ

Meaning:

* Face * Presence * Front or surface

Noun. Masculine. Although it looks plural in form (ending in -ים), it is almost always used as a singular in meaning - a type of plural of intensity or plural of form common in Hebrew for body parts that come in pairs or have multiple aspects.
