Hebrew	The Hebrew את word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence. For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בְּרֵאשִׁית הָאֱלֹהִים (מְנוּחַת הַזֶּהב עָשָׂר כְּמִשְׁפָּטָם וַיִּתֵּן בְּהִיכָל חֹמֶשׁ מִיָּמִין וְחֹמֶשׁ מִשְׁמָאל
ESV	And he made ten golden lampstands as prescribed, and set them in the temple, five on the south side and five on the north.
NIV	He made ten gold lampstands according to the specifications for them and placed them in the temple, five on the south side and five on the north.
NLT	He then cast ten gold lampstands according to the specifications that had been given, and he put them in the Temple. Five were placed against the south wall, and five were placed against the north wall.
