ESV	And all the men of Israel assembled before the king at the feast that is in the seventh month.
NIV	And all the men of Israel came together to the king at the time of the festival in the seventh month.
NLT	So all the men of Israel assembled before the king at the annual Festival of Shelters, which is held in early autumn.

	* To or towards * Pertaining to (genitive case) * Near to (dative case) * According to * About
	Preposition. Occurs 703 times in the New Testament.
	πρὸς is a common preposition in Koine Greek that carries different meanings. It most frequently takes the accusative case, but at times it takes the genitive or dative cases, giving it a different meaning again. 	* All * Every * The whole
	Adjective.
	Usage in the New Testament
	The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
	With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9John 3:16Romans 5:12Matthew 28:19Colossians 1:16Romans 3:23Romans 3:23John 3:16Colossians 1:17 ἄνθρωπος ἰσραηλ ἐν plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν

	Preposition meaning “in”. τῇ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ

	The definite article ἐορτῇ οὗτος plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigοὗτος / αὕτη / τοῦτο
	greek
	Meaning:
	* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it
	Demonstrative pronoun.
	οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 ὁ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ

	The definite article μὴν ἑβδομος

KJV	Wherefore all the men of Israel assembled themselves unto the king in the feast which was in the seventh month.
