It is distinct from ὅτι ("that," introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning ἀναγινώσκετε ἢ καὶ
Greek	greek Meaning * And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as "and" ἐπιγινώσκετε, ἐλπίζω δὲ greek δέ is a conjunction that can mean "but" or "and" or "also" or "moreover". It is a word that is used very frequently in the New Testament, and is often unexpressed and not translated in English. ὅτι ἕως τέλους ἐπιγνώσεσθε,
ESV	For we are not writing to you anything other than what you read and acknowledge and I hope you will fully acknowledge-
NIV	For we do not write you anything you cannot read or understand. And I hope that,
NLT	Our letters have been straightforward, and there is nothing written between the lines and nothing you can't understand. I hope someday you will fully understand us,
KJV	For we write none other things unto you, than what ye read or acknowledge; and I trust ye shall acknowledge even to the end;
