Meaning:

* These or this * This one, this person, this thing * They or he or she or it

Demonstrative pronoun.

οὗτος usually refers to something close to the speaker — “this” as opposed to ἐκεῖνος (John 9:161 John 5:111 Corinthians 15:501 John 4:9John 5:1Matthew 3:17John 7:26Luke 22:19 οὗν βουλόμενος μήτι ἄρα τῇ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

The definite article ἐλαφρία ἐχρησάμην; ἡ ἃ βουλεύομαι κατὰ σάρκα βουλεύομαι, ἵνα ἡ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big εἰμί

greek

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. παρ’ ἐμοὶ τὸ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big

* And * Also * Both * Even * Too * So

Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” τὸ plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big
