	Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἡκουσεν ἄρρητα ῥήματα ἃ

	Meaning:
Greek	* Who * Which * What
	The relative pronoun that connects a relative clause to a main clause, referring back to a noun or pronoun (called the antecedent).
	It is distinct from ὅτι (“that,” introducing indirect speech) and from ὅς as an interrogative in older Greek (meaning οὐκ ἔξδὸν ἀνθρώπῳ λαλῆσαι.
	οὐκ ἔξδὸν ἀνθρώπῳ λαλῆσαι.

ESV	and he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter.
NIV	was caught up to paradise. He heard inexpressible things, things that man is not permitted to tell.
NLT	that I was caught up to paradise and heard things so astounding that they cannot be expressed in words, things no human is allowed to tell.
KJV	How that he was caught up into paradise, and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter.

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
