The word is dual in form (ending in -ים) which normally indicates two things (like eyes and hands), however, however it functions as a plural. NIV	See, fire has fallen from heaven and consumed the first two captains and all their men. But now have respect for my life!"
NLT	See how the fire from heaven came down and destroyed the first two groups. But now please spare my life!"

The definite article οὐρανοῦ

Meaning:

\* The sky \* Air \* Heaven or heavens

278 occurrences in the New Testament.

Οὐρανός is used in Scripture to describe the sky and universe (that is, the visible expanse above the earth) as well as the transcendent realm where God is present. For example, in Matthew 6:26Matthew 24:29Matthew 6:9 καὶ
