The Hebrew את word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a Hebrew marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בַּרָא אֵלהֵים (בָּגָדֵיו וַיִּתְכֵּס בַּשֶּׁק וַיָּבָא בֵּית יהוֹהplugin-autotooltip default plugin-autotooltip big

It is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word יהוֹה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.
