Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἐάν εἴπη οὕτως οὐκ ἠθέληκα ἐνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigἐν

Preposition meaning “in”. σοί ἰδοὺ ἐγὼ εἰμιplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί

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εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ποιεῖτωplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigποιέω

This verb - to do or make - is used in connection with a large range of activities including creation, covenant formation, obedience, miracles, sin and worship.
