Is a conjunction that connects single words or terms or sentences. IT is most frequently translated as “and” ἥνplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigεἰμί

εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”).

It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. Δαυιδ ἐρχόμενος ἕως τοῦplugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὸ

Personal pronoun (reflexive). Occurs more than 5,000 times in the New Testament.

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Meaning:

* Soil or ground (e.g. Matthew 13:5) * Land (e.g. Luke 4:5) * Country * Earth (e.g. Matthew 5:5)

Feminine noun. Connected to the English words “ground”, “geometry” and “geology”.

It occurs throughout the LXX and the New Testament (approximately 250 times in the New Testament) and its meaning varies subtly on context, for example, in the LXX:Genesis 1:1Genesis 2:7Genesis 12:1 **ἐπὶ τῆς**plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_bigὁ
