### Meaning

\* Yahweh - God's personal name

lt is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word הוָה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

First appearing in Genesis 2:4, it occurs over 6,000 times in the Old Testament. ### hebrew

The Hebrew, אַת word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by בָּא אָלהָים ( עֶצֶת אָחִיתֹּפֶל הָטוֹבָה לְבָעֶבֹּוּר הָבֵיא יָהוֶה default plugin-Hebrew autotooltip\_bigמָּיִה

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And Absalom and all the men of Israel said, "The counsel of Hushai the Archite is better than the counsel of Ahithophel." For the LORD had ESV ordained to defeat the good counsel of Ahithophel, so that the LORD might bring harm upon Absalom.

Absalom and all the men of Israel said, "The advice of Hushai the Arkite is better than that of Ahithophel." For the LORD had determined to NIV frustrate the good advice of Ahithophel in order to bring disaster on Absalom.

Then Absalom and all the men of Israel said, "Hushai's advice is better than Ahithophel's." For the LORD had determined to defeat the NLT counsel of Ahithophel, which really was the better plan, so that he could bring disaster on Absalom!

Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.
