The Hebrew [אָת](#) word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.

For example, in Genesis 1:1 the word is preceded by [בְּרָא אֱלֹהִים \(הִירָדוֹ וְהַמָּלָךְ עָבַר וַיֵּשֶׁק הַמָּלָךְ לְבָרָזְלִי](#) [בְּרָדָּהוּ](#) [plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big](#)

Meaning

* To kneel * To bless God as an act of adoration * To bless man as a benefit * Sometimes, to curse

Verb, appearing approximately 330 times in the Old Testament.

The word [בְּרָדָּהוּ](#) marks important moments of covenant, worship, inheritance and hope. Genesis 1:28 Psalm 103:1 Numbers 6:24 [וַיֵּשֶׁב לְמִקְמוֹ](#)

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
