A combination of the words οὐ (meaning no) and δέ (meaning however or but). The word οὐδέ adds

Usage in the New Testament

The sense of πᾶς depends on whether it modifies a singular or plural noun, and whether that noun is countable or uncountable.

With singular countable nouns → "every" John 1:9 John 3:16 Romans 5:12 Matthew 28:19 Colossians 1:16 Romans 3:23 Romans 3:23 John 3:16 Colossians 1:17 **ἡμεῖς σήμερον νεκροί ὅτι τότε τὸ** plugin-autotooltip__default plugin-autotooltip_big
