This is the foundational verb of existence, identity, becoming and occurrence.

\* Yahweh - God's personal name

lt is not a generic term for "god", but rather the word אָרָה (YHWH) is the name by which God uniquely identifies himself in the Old Testament.

## Hebrew

The Hebrew, word does not have a corresponding word in English. In Hebrew, it is a marker of the accusative, i.e. the word following it is the object of the sentence.
