	The definite article καλουμένου ἐλαιῶνος, ὃ ἐστίν

	εἰμί is the first person singular verb for “to be” (εἶναι [the infinitive form] = “to be”). It an irregular verb, and, like English, changes significantly between person and tense. For example εἰμί is the word for am and ἦν is the word for was, e.g. ἐγγὺς Ἱερουσαλὴμ σαββάτου ἔχον ὁδόν.
ESV	Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a Sabbath day's journey away.
NIV	Then they returned to Jerusalem from the hill called the Mount of Olives, a Sabbath day's walk from the city.
NLT	Then the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives, a distance of half a mile.
KJV	Then returned they unto Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is from Jerusalem a sabbath day's journey.

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
